At the November 14th meeting of the Board of Education there was a lengthy discussion regarding the book <u>Life's</u> <u>Greatest Lessons</u>, by Dr. Hal Urban. Every school determines the criteria for membership within each of these four standards, based on the guidelines provided by the national organization handbook. Seniors and juniors with an overall grade point

average of 85 or better are invited to submit an information packet for review. The students provide evidence of their achievements in the four areas. A group of 5 faculty members then review the information submitted and consider it in light of the four standards—academic achievement, character, leadership, and service.

In the week preceding the induction, our 21 existing members of NHS organize the induction ceremony and invite the parents of the students selected to the ceremony.

Directed by Paul Liedmen, the comedy Hook, Line and Sink Her is led by an interesting cast of A pushy mother (Amber Marie Payne), a nervous father (Jamal Abdunnasir), a whiny bride (Serenity Carlyle), a younger brother too busy eating to ever say a word (Ethan Rehor), and countless other small-town characters make this one of the most hilarious weddings you'll ever attend.
