- CALL TO ORDER Kari Durham President, called the meeting to order at 7:34 PM and led the Pledge of Allegiance,

2. PUBLIC ACCESS No one spoke to the Board.
3. PRESENTATIONS No presentations were made.
- 4a. AUDIT COMMITTEE Judi Buckalew reported that the committee has met.
- 4d. STUDENT BOARD MEMBER REPORT Laura McDorman reported that due to low participation, there will be no JV Girls Soccer and no JV Boys Volleyball teams this year. Freshman orientation is scheduled for August 28th.
- 4f. OTHER GOOD NEWS Kari Durham reported that Ben Gerstner, former student board member, is adapting well at at student at U of R.
Judi Buckalew reported on the Rotary foreign exchange student. He is from Mumbai, India, is very personable and articulate.
Amy Lynch-Johnson reported that students in the Summer Escape program had a penny war. They brought in loose change from home during the program. They raised \$560.00 for charity.
- 5a. CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION UPDATE Cinda Lisanto reported on the massive amount of work done by 48 teachers over the summer to write pre and post tests and to write curriculum to implement the Common Core Learning Standards. She gave kudos to them all for their dedication to students.
- 5b. BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR UPDATE Robert Magin reported that upon further investigation, there is no insurance coverage on the freezer that malfunctioned, resulting in the loss of a large amount of food. He will be bringing a resolution to the Board to recommend that the loss be paid for from an insurance reserve.
The audit is almost complete. He commended his staff for being ready for the external audit to be completed earlier than in past years.
SEI Design Group and Campus Construction met with district administrators to discuss preparations for a public vote of a capital project.

5c. SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

In response to questions from the Board, Mr. Walker distributed a summary of grant funding for the 2013-14 school year. Dave Murphy and Michele Sullivan will be giving the board detailed information at a future board meeting.

John Walker reported that the State Education Department just released graduation rate information for the entire state. The district's graduation rose 7.1% to 86.4 percent! The hard work being done in the Alternative Learning Center is clearly instrumental in increasing our graduation rate.

School opens this week for staff. The district hired 14+ people.
