While on that board, I served on several committees including Audit, Skateboard, the Wayne County Education Coalition, and the Board Retreat Planning Committee. I also participated in search committees for vice principals, principals, and a superintendent.

I also served on the Four County School Boards Association Legislative Committee and Board of Directors, including a term as Chair of the Legislative Committee.
