Parents' Right to Know Information

According to the No Child Left Behind legislation, any school that receives federal funding through the Title I federal grant must provide information to parents about the qualifications of the teachers in that school. The Dalton Elementary School receives Title I funding. Parents have a right to know information regarding the teacher's certification for their child's class and any qualifications of the paraprofessionals that are serving their child.

hind legislation. It is the largest federal education program for elementary and secondary schools in the United States. Each state receives part of the federal funds that was appropriated for this school year. This summer, we will apply to the New York State Education Department for a portion of these state funds.

Keshequa receives funding from Title I, Part A, which specifically targets academic achievement for students who need additional assistance. Other Title grants target areas like professional development, use of technology in instruction, innovative programming, and school safety. We use the Title I, Part A monies to help pay salaries of remediation and summer school teachers, provide supplies and materials to remedia-

As with any grant, there are requirements that schools must follow if they accept these federal funds. We must complete

a budget as part of the grant application and follow it during the course of the year. We need to report the numbers of students who receive help as part of the Title I grant. We must communicate with parents if their children are receiving extra academic help through Title I services, like academic intervention. Also, a new law requires us to set aside a small portion of the Title I funds to assist any homeless children in our schools.

Parent/Teen Communication

Research suggests that teens do better when parents, whether single parents, two parents or any other family type, are:

- Warm and supportive
- Provide clear expectations for behavior
- Model the respect that they expect from their child

The following are some tips for parents and guardians:

- Be a parent, not a friend. Children need and expect clear boundaries. It shows that you care about them.
- Ignore the teen attitude. Learn to select your battles. Pick the more important issues.
- Talk about the tough stuff. It is important that your children know how you feel about issues such as sex, and drug and alcohol use.
- Compliment them. Make a habit out of saying at least 3 positive things every day.

• Get to know their friends and friends' parents. As you learn about their friends, you will also learn more about your own teen.

• Don't be a maid. Teens need meaningful rules and responsibilities. Don't do every-thing for them.

• Respect and be respected. If you expect respect, you need to show them respect on a daily basis.

- Listen, and don't lecture. When they are ready to talk, listen and try to resist the urge to give too much advice or tell them what to do. Help them figure it out themselves by asking them questions to guide their decisions.
- Agree to disagree. It's normal to feel like you disagree about everything. Teens like to question the norm but always remember that you have the final word when it comes to how your teen should behave.
- Have fun together. Find out what fun means to your teen and try to make fun times and good memories with them.



Elementary students who walk to the Nunda bus circle to ride a bus to Dalton should be at the bus circle between 7:45 and 7:50 am. If you drive your child(ren) to school please drop them off in front of the school buildings. The school bus circles must be kept clear for buses to unload.

Remember it is always unlawful to pass a stopped school bus when the red lights at the top front and rear are flashing, even on school grounds.
