For the week of May 5, students will explore and reveal themes established by imagery; issues of power as established by on-stage drama, notably in scenes with Claudius; and matters of irony.

After reading the text outside of class, students will view the Mel Gibson movie.

For part of each period, students begin drafts for essay chosen from handout.
