4. Facilities Department

- With the recent termination of a cleaner (retroactive BOE action next week), we now have two open positions.
- Dan is working with our IT department and BOCES to prepare the new DO space in the Electromark building.

5. Technology

 At Tuesday's meeting you will be appointing our new Coordinator of Network and Technology Services. She comes to us with multiple years of experience working in the IT department of Marion Central School District.

6. Capital Projects/Building Improvements/Ongoing Maintenance

- We anticipate SED approval very soon for our capital project plans. The bidding period began on February 8. Over the next month, contractors will be reviewing the bid documents, asking clarifying questions, and preparing their sealed bids. The bids will be opened at 3:30 on March 8 in the high school small cafeteria.
 We anticipate that the BOE will then formally award the bids at the March 13 meeting.
- The Smart Schools Instructional Plan will need to have final BOE approval at next Tuesday's meeting. This is the first step in accessing \$1,484,019 in Smart Schools Bond funding to be directed to the middle school.

7. Budgeting/Reserves

- The first draft of the instructional budget will be reviewed at next Tuesday's meeting.
- At the February 23 meeting we will look at reserves and I will also share the first draft of a revenue budget.

8. Other Notes

- I have attached information outlining Deputy Pitt's activities for the month of January, including a written summary.
- As you know, our treasurer, Kathy Krivitza, is retiring at the end of March. In
 order to transition, there will be numerous items requiring BOE action at one of
 the March meetings. These involve both treasury duties as well as some of my
 duties as we move to the new configuration of a Shared School Business
 Manager (3 days a week) and treasury work being completed at the BOCES
 Central Business Office.

While there was an increase in criminal investigations, with some involving our students as victims outside of the school, the large majority of infractions are able to be dealt with through the school, following code of conduct.

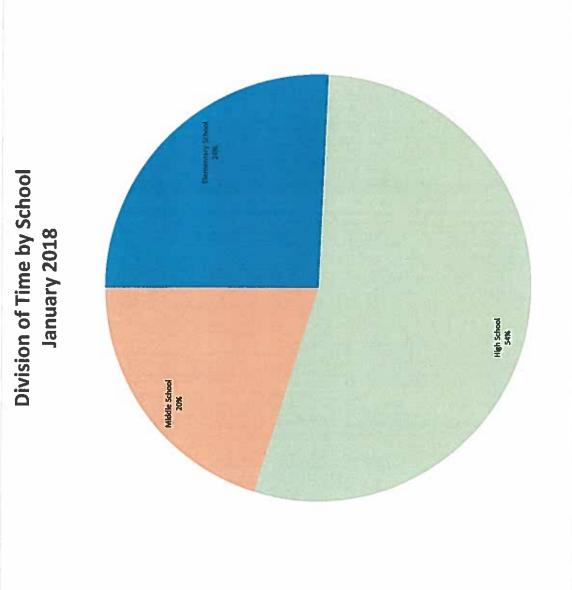
In January I was able to participate in two afterschool programs with elementary students as well as take part in the Florentina Fun Days reward program for those students who regularly met expectations in all aspects.

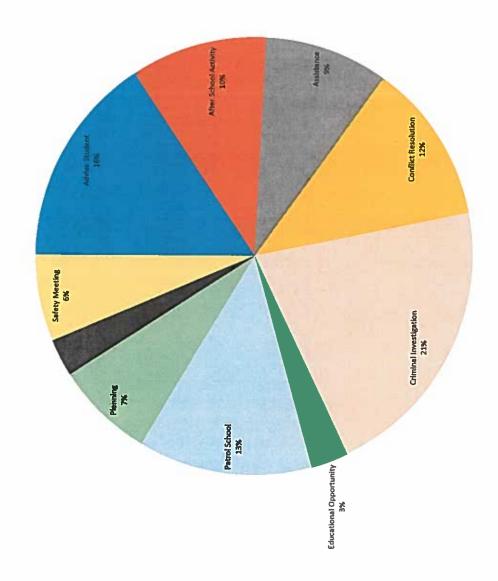

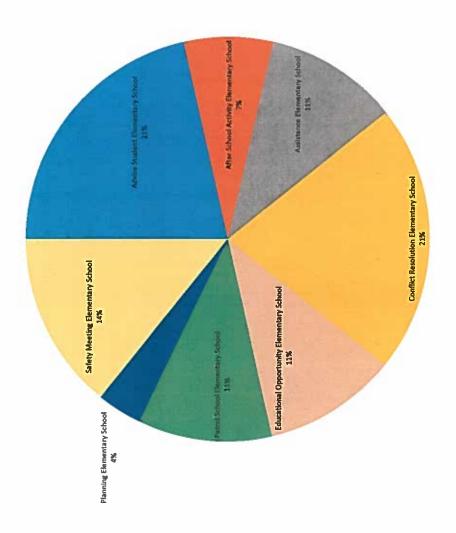

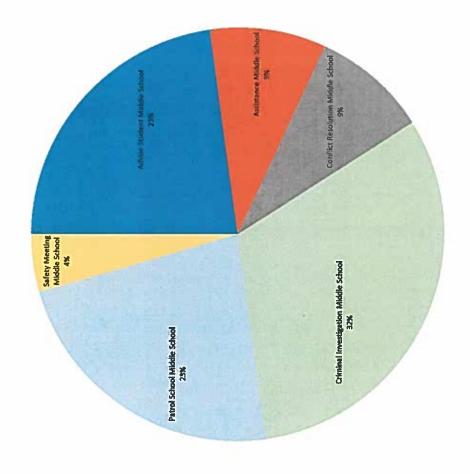
Division of Time by Activity Type January 2018
