Professional Development:

-7-12 Social Studies teachers spent a week in August in professional development curriculum writing

-3 days were spent on ELA curriculum writing with a focus on pacing of the modules, and 2 days were spent on math, again the focus was on pacing of the modules. About 30 teachers attended ELA and about 20 attended math.

-3 days were spent writing 3-8 interim assessments in math and ELA, with some professional development around assessment writing at the beginning. There are only 3 grade 3 sets of assessments that were not created and they will be by the DCI and building administrators.

-Had a great 2 days of new teacher orientation, with 22 new staff members in attendance. The focus was on common core, professionalism & feedback, and APPR. We have a great group of new staff members that are going to add a lot to the district.

-We had a very packed set of opening days to school last week. Day 1 was spent giving an overview of the data and where we are headed as a district, with the afternoon being spent in the buildings. Day 2 consisted of classroom time and professional development around the school-based inquiry process, which is a data-driven dialogue process, presented by staff developers from Monroe2/Orleans BOCES. Day 3 was spent in faculty meetings and professional development regarding Ruby Payne's latest book, <u>A Framework for Understanding Poverty: A Cognitive Approach</u>, which was presented by Hank Hann and Yvonne Saner.

-Staff did other curriculum writing outside of the boot camp days and many also attended other trainings over the summer.

-many end of year reports were completed for varying grants over the summer
