SCHOLARSHIPS

If you are a foreign student currently enrolled in a post-secondary school, college or university, you may be able to qualify for a UNSC scholarship. To qualify, you must demonstrate financial need and/or academic excellence and must be an active member of UNSC. For more information or to request an application for UNSC membership, call, email, fax or write.

STUDENT LOANS

You may be able to qualify for an interest-free charitable loan if you show proof of your ability to repay the loan. To qualify you must demonstrate foreign student status, need, academic excellence and UNSC membership. For more information or to request an application for membership call, fax, email or write to the United Nations Education Council.

PRACTICAL TRAINING & INTERNSHIPS

If your goal is to get a job related to your academic major for the purpose of acquiring work experience then these opportunities are designed for you. The United Nations Student Council may be able to place you in a company or organization in the U.S. or abroad as an intern or practical trainee. These opportunities may be able to help you earn academic credits, income and work experience. They are designed to prepare you for post-graduation employment. To take advantage of these opportunities, you must have accumulated enough academic credits related to your major, show proof of foreign student status and UNSC membership. JOB OPPORTUNITIES & SUMMER HIRE PROGRAM

If your really need a job to help finance your education, to provide for your living expenses or just to gain some work experience, these opportunities would be excellent for you. Some of these jobs will allow you to work on-campus; some will allow you to work from your home, while others will allow you to work off-campus. Most off-campus positions are available during the summer through the Summer Hire Program. Some jobs are offered directly by the United Nations Education Council, while others are offered by participating companies and organizations in the U.S. and abroad. GREEN CARDS & OTHER IMMIGRATION OPPORTUNITIES

If you would like to obtain a Green Card, a Work Permit, a Work Visa, or if you want to change your status or extend your authorized period of stay in the U.S., or if you just need a free consultation in any area of immigration, the American Immigration Agency is ready to assist you. You don't have to be a UNSC member to take advantage of these opportunities, but UNSC members have special advantages. GREEN CARDS THROUGH THE NATIONAL INTEREST

The American Immigration Agency may guarantee you an approved Green Card Petition or all your money back if you answer "Yes" to at least three of the following questions: (1) Are you a professional or researcher? (2) Do you have a Graduate Degree (or a Bachelor's Degree plus 5 years of work experience)? (3) Have you ever written and published any scholarly articles? (4) Have you ever received any prizes or awards for your excellence? (5) Has anybody ever published any material about you? (6) Have you ever been a judge of the work of others? (7) Have you ever performed in a leading or critical role for any reputable organization? (8) Do you have any original contributions of major significance to your field? (9) Are you a member of any professional association anywhere in the world? (10) Do you have at least ten years of work experience in your field? (11) Have you ever earned a comparatively higher salary than other professionals in your field? (12) Are you licensed or certified to practice your profession? (13) Has your work ever been displayed at artistic exhibitions or showcases? (14) Have you ever achieved commercial success in performing arts?

If you answered "Yes" to at least three of the questions above, contact the American Immigration Information Center and schedule for a free phone consultation or request for Publication I-400.

GREEN CARDS FOR PROFESSORS & RESEARCHERS

The American Immigration Agency may be able to guarantee you an approved Green Card Petition if you are a professor or researcher with at least three years of experience. To qualify, you must be offered a tenure or tenure track teaching or research position at a university or other institution of higher learning in the U.S. or if you are a researcher, be offered a research position by a private company with at least three full time research employees. In addition, you must answer "Yes" to at least two of the following questions: (1) Have you ever received major prizes or awards? (2) Are you a member of associations which require outstanding achievements of their members? (3) Has anybody ever published materials about your work in professional journals? (4) Have you ever participated as a judge of the work of others? (5) Have you ever made any original scientific or scholarly research contributions to your field? (6) Are you an author of scholarly books or articles in journals with international circulation in your field? If you think you stand a chance of qualifying as an outstanding professor or researcher, contact the American Immigration Information Center and schedule for a Free Phone Consultation or request for publication I-420.

THE GREEN CARD LOTTERY (DV-2000)

Play the Green Card Lottery and if you win, you may receive a Green Card. If you would like to receive free information about the next Green Card Lottery, contact the American Immigration Information Center.

GREEN CARDS FOR NICARAGUANS AND CUBANS
