IMPORTANT NOTES...

District Wide Policies and Procedures

Absence Notification

Students are expected to demonstrate a sense of punctuality. Lateness to class or homeroom may result in placement within the school discipline system. To participate in extra-curricular activities a student must be in school by 9:15 am and must remain throughout the day unless excused by the building administration

Absence Procedures

A written excuse, signed by the parent or legal guardian must be presented by the student on the day of returning to school. Excessive tardiness or truancy may result in penalties for such abuse of the established attendance requirements.

Eligibility for Extracurricular Activities and Code of Ethics Preparedness

An academic eligibility policy exists for the participation of students in extracurricular activities. For more specific information see the advisor of the club or activity or the coach of the sport.

Attendance At School

Pupils enrolled in the district must attend school regularly according to State Law. The educational program of the district requires regular attendance to provide continuity of instruction and classroom participation. School is a place where pupils have the opportunity to interact and participate in planned instructional activities under the guidance of competent teachers. Excessive absenteeism has a highly adverse effect on students and the educational program.

Child Abuse

School personnel who have reasonable cause to suspect child abuse or maltreatment are required by NYS law to report such to the building principal. The principal shall be responsible for reporting this abuse to the NYS Central Registry of Child Abuse and Maltreatment.

Discipline and Student Behavior

Williamson has a comprehensive discipline program. Students are expected to behave appropriately at all times. For more specific information on discipline policies and procedures please consult the student or parent handbooks distributed by each of the buildings.

Dress Code

Williamson Central does not have a formalized dress code. A student's appearance is a reflection of how he/she feels about themselves. Students are requested to dress neatly, cleanly and to show good taste in their appearance. State law provides that school authorities may prohibit dress which is so distractive as to interfere with the learning process.

Emergency Closings - Early Dismissal

If school is to be closed due to inclement weather or other emergency, an announcement will be made on the **WHAM** radio station. When school is closed all afternoon and evening activities are canceled. Working parents should leave directions and emergency numbers with the school so that they may be contacted. The bus garage will remain open until all buses return from their runs.

Emergency Evacuations

School districts are required by law to have a minimum number of fire drills and emergency drills designed to prepare students and staff to deal with potential emergencies. Students will receive specific instructions and directions prior to these staged drills

Free/Reduced Lunch

This district participates in the National School Lunch Program in an agreement with the NYS Education Department to receive commodities donated by the Department of Agriculture and to accept responsibility for providing free and reduced price lunch to pupils in the school district whose families meet income eligibility guidelines.

Fund Raising

All fund raising projects must be approved by the building principal in the building where the fund raising is to take place. Tickets or articles of any kind, other than those associated with school activities, are not to be sold on school property by students or outside organizations.

GED General Education Diploma

The policy of the Williamson Central School District is to provide opportunities for residents without a high school diploma to receive instruction to assist in preparing for the GED test. This instruction may be offered in conjunction with BOCES or other school districts.



Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate from the Williamson Central School District a student must successfully complete 20 and 1/2 units of credit. For more complete details on graduation requirements consult the high school guidance department, handbook, and course of studies.

Testing

Students throughout the grades take a variety of standardized and state produced tests. Each building publishes a schedule of the tests the students take and the dates they will be taken. For more information consult the individual buildings.

Title IX

The Williamson Central School District does not discriminate on the basis of sex in the educational programs or activities which it operates, and it is required by Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 not to discriminate in such a manner. This policy of non-discrimination includes the following areas: recruitment and services for students, access by students to educational programs, course offerings, and student activities.

Transportation to Public and Non-Public School

The district provides transportation between home and school for all children attending grades K-12 who live not more than fifteen miles from the public school they legally attend, with no minimum distance requirement. Designated pick-up points are established for children of the district who live more than fifteen miles from the non-public school they attend. A written request from a parent or guardian desiring transportation to a parochial or private school should be submitted to the superintendent of schools no later than April 1 of the preceding year, or within 30 days of moving into the district. No late requests will be denied where a reasonable explanation is provided regarding the delay. Handicapped students of the district shall be transported up to fifty miles one way from their home to an appropriate special service or program.

Screening of New Students

Screening procedures for every new entrant into district schools shall be provided to determine pupils educational needs. For more information on screening, please contact the guidance office in any of the school buildings.

Use Of School Facilities

Use of the school buildings and outdoor facilities for community-wide activities by recognized civic, social, fraternal, religious, and not for profit groups is encouraged. Groups wishing to use school facilities must secure written permission from the superintendent of schools and abide by the rules and regulations established for such. A certificate of insurance will be required. To begin the process secure a building use form from the building which facilities you wish to use. This must be submitted ten working days prior to the event. For more information contact the main office in any of the buildings.

Visitors

While parents and all others are welcome to visit during school hours, all visitors must report to the office upon arrival at school and state the purpose of their visit. Visitors wishing to visit classrooms must give advance notice which requires the approval of the building principal. (Note: High School students are not permitted to bring student visitors with them for the school day.)

Voting on the School Budget

All citizens who have been residents of the Williamson Central School District for 30 days prior to a vote and who are American citizens over the age of 18 are eligible to vote. For people who meet the following criteria, an absentee ballot is also available:

A patient in a hospital, or unable to appear because of illness or physical disability. Because of duties, occupation or business which will require a person to be outside the country.

Because of a vacation outside the country.

Because a person will be absent from their voting residence because he/he will be detained in jail.

Health Information

Immunizations

Under Public Health Law, all students are required to be immunized against measles, polio, diphtheria, mumps, and rubella. A physician's certificate or other acceptable evidence must be submitted for all children entering and attending school. Transfer students will have fourteen days (intrastate) or thirty days (interstate) to produce evidence of immunization. For more information contact the school nurse in each building.

Insurance

All students are covered by the district under a group plan with student accident insurance policies acting as co-insurance with family coverage as the primary coverage. All accidents must be reported to your teacher immediately. The accident policy is designed to cover or assist in covering expenses resulting from accidental injury to any student while at school or involved in a school sponsored activity. The policy does not pay in addition to other coverage for which the injured person is eligible. Payments made under any other health coverage are included in the \$10,000 maximum provided by the School Accident Policy. If students qualify under another policy, all claims must be processed against that policy (or policies) first. This includes the regular family Blue Cross/Blue Shield policy. The School Accident Policy will pay a portion of the balance for covered services (up to the maximum) after the primary insurance coverage. For further information, see one of the school nurses.

Medications At School

For your protection, and the protection of the student body, school officials are prohibited by law from administering medication to pupils. In urgent cases, however, the school nurse is allowed to cooperate when it is necessary for a child to have medication while in school. Parents are to bring such medications to the nurse with their signed statement and one from the doctor. No student may carry with them either prescription or non-prescription drugs on their person, in their possessions, or in their locker.

Sodus: Take Rt. 104 east to Rt. 88 south. Follow Rt. 88 south through the Village of Sodus. Turn left on Benton Place. The high school is on the right.

Wayne: Take Ridge Road west through the Town of Ontario to Ontario Center. Turn left on Rt. 350. The high school is on the left.

Finger Lakes Schools

Bloomfield: Rt. 21 south to Canandaigua. Left on Rt. 332 to Rts. 5 and 20.

Right on 5 and 20 to Oakmount Avenue in Bloomfield (by water tower). Right

on Oakmount. The high school is on the left.

Physicals (Athletics)

Physicals for participation in athletics are required by law. For more information on athletic physicals please contact the nurse at the appropriate building.

Physical Exams

School physicals are administered to pupils at the K, 1, 3, 7, and 10 grade levels. It should be emphasized that this is not a complete diagnostic workup. Conditions requiring further attention are referred to the parents for follow-up with the family physician. If parents prefer, they may have a physician of their choice perform the screening providing the completed forms are returned to the health office by the end of the first week of school.

School Health Screenings

An annual test for distance visual acuity, an individual pure tonal audiometer (Grade 10 only at high school), and color perception tests are performed during the school year. Students who show evidence of sight or hearing problems will be referred to parents for further action. Scoliosis examinations are made annually to students who are up to and including sixteen years of age. An annual check of height and weight will be recorded by the school nurse in the student's health file.

Hornell: Rt. 104 west to Rt. 590. Rt. 590 south to Rt. 390 south. Rt. 390 south to Exit 4 in Dansville. Rt. 36 south to Hornell. The high school is on left in the City of Hornell.

Marcus Whitman: Rt. 21 south to Canandaigua. Left on Rt. 332 through the City of Canandaigua. Left on Rts. 5 and 20 to East Lake Road. Right on East Lake Road. East lake Road to Lincoln Hill Road. Left on Lincoln Hill Road. First right on Middle Road. At stop sign, left on Baldwin Road. The high school is on the left.

Midlakes: Rt. 21 south to Rt. 31 in Palmyra. Left on Rt 31 to Newark and Rt. 88. South on Rt. 88 to Phelps and Rt. 96. Right on Rt. 96 to Rt. 488. Left on Rt. 488. The high school is on the right.

Mynderse: Rt. 104 east to Rt. 414. Right on Rt. 414 to Seneca Falls. Left on Rts. 5 and 20 to the Village of Seneca Falls. Left on Mynderse Street. Right on Chapel Street. Left on Troy Street.

Newark: Rt. 21 south to Palmyra and Rt. 31. Left on Rt. 31 to the Village of Newark. Right on Pierson Avenue. The high school is on the right.

Red Jacket: Rt. 21 south through Palmyra and Manchester. School is on the right south side of the Village of Manchester.

South Seneca: Rt. 104 east to Rt. 14. Go south on Rt. 14 to the City of Geneva. Go left on Rts. 5 and 20 east to Rt. 96A. South on Rt. 96A to Ovid. Turn right at the stop light. The high school is on main street in Ovid.

Victor: Rt. 21 south through Palmyra to Rt. 96 (just past the Thruway entrance). Right on Rt. 96 to the Village of Victor. Go through the village to High Street. Turn right on High Street. School complex is on the right.
