Scope: Drawing and Painting students will study the four basic forms of drawing (cube, cylinder, cone, and sphere) and apply these forms to drawing natural and inatimate objects in space. Drawing knowledge will then be applied as a basis for various painting techniques at mid-year point. Along the way, several drawing and painting media will be utilized.

Methodology:

Lessons in drawing the four basic forms will include instructional handouts showing step-by-step processes. Teacher will demonstrate the use of perspective drawing on the chalkboard as guided practice for students drawing at desks. Teacher will demonstrate how to combine the four forms in a group form such as a still life.

Similar handouts and chalkboard guide practice will accompany lessons in Portraiture, Figure Drawing, Architectural Drawing etc. Several exemplars of student work and teacher work will be displayed for students to measure quality level to be achieved.

Painting projects will involve preliminary units in exploring the handling of each type of paint used. Students will experience the differences of each. Painting lessons will share many of the same skills learned in drawing class as drawing will be the basis for the paintings.
