POSSESSIVE NOUNS

- The possessive form of a noun shows ownership, possession, or the general relationship between two nouns.
- Add an apostrophe and –s to form the possessive of a singular noun, even one that already ends in *s*.
- <u>Use an apostrophe alone</u> to form the possessive of a plural noun that ends in *s*.

EXAMPLES

SINGULAR POSSESSIVE

the kitten's tail her dress's collar the wife's speech the cookie's decoration the story's villain

PLURAL POSSESSIVE

the kittens' tails her dresses' collars the wives' speeches the cookies' decorations the stories' villains

• Add an apostrophe and –s to form the possessive of a plural <u>noun that does not end in s</u>.

EXAMPLES

the oxen's stalls the children's books the women's trophies
