Cold War Review Two

East Germany especially East Berlin (city) became the focus of the Cold War

What was it called when the Soviets attempted to get control of West Berlin by cutting off supplies to the city. The U.S. flew in supplies by air for nearly a year until the Soviets backed down

Berlin Airlift

Cold War heated up in the early 60's

What part of Latin America became communist <u>Cuba</u>

What event in Latin America almost led to World War III? Cuban missile crisis

U.S. backed Fidel Castro

until he turned communist. Then the CIA worked to overthrow him

Central Intelligence Agency operates OUTSIDE of the U.S. U.S. spy agency - to spy and operate against foreign spies outside the U.S.

Federal Bureau of Investigation operates mainly inside the U.S. (anti-spy agency to catch foreign spies here)

Where U.S. backed Cuba rebels
landed in Cuba but were massacred
by Castro's troops
(very embarrassing to the CIA and
President Kennedy)

Bay of Pigs

When Kennedy blockaded Cuba

Cuban Missile Crisis

U.S. spy planes flying over Cuba detected Soviet <u>missiles</u> (major threat to U.S. security)

President Kennedy ordered warships to blockade Cuba
U.S. and Soviet ships faced off

Very close to war but at the last minute the Soviets backed down and removed the missiles

U.S. concerned about communism

in Latin America spreading from Cuba

C.I.A. operated in Latin America giving money, weapons and support countries fighting against communism

U.S. fought an unsuccessful war in Vietnam

to stop the spread of communism

A large part of the American population Opposed (protested) the war in Vietnam (also called Southeast Asia)

Eisenhower: sent money and weapons to help France fight the communists

President Kennedy sent weapons and advisors to South Vietnam to help them fight the communists

L. Johnson sent in U.S. troops to Vietnam in increasingly greater numbers

Nixon vowed to decrease military numbers, but bombed North Vietnam to try to get them to end the war
