TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Your child's safety is our primary goal. To ensure this we encourage open lines of communication between our office, the driver, the student, the parents and the school.

The first couple weeks of school are a matter of getting familiar with new routines, bus rules, school rules, new friends, new adults and new surroundings. We try to encourage consistency with our buses to help ease this transition. Our drivers are the first and last adults to see your child and will in some cases have them in their care for the next 13 years.

The first day of school we will run a special pick up just for our kindergarten students. This is a great time to allow for pictures, getting to know your driver, and share any pertinent information with them.

Pick up and drop off times are very consistent through out the year typically within If your child needs to go 5 minutes given weather, bus mechanical failures, traffic or tardiness of other students. Please always have your child ready 5 minutes prior to their designated pick up time. At drop off time please make sure the driver knows that someone is home, wave out

the door, leave garage door open, car is in the driveway etc. If ever there is a concern with bus conduct, let your driver know. While we can't hold up traffic to have conversation, a quick note or phone call will alert the driver.

anywhere other than home on a permanent basis a transportation request form must be turned in to us by July 1st.

The Wayne CSD school budget for the 2008-2009 school year was passed on May 20, 2008 with a 75 percent vote. The WTA used a portion of its returned VOTE-COPE contributions from NYSUT to launch a Get Out the Vote campaign in support of the budget. As part of this campaign the WTA mailed letters to fellow NYSUT retirees and members from other school districts who were eligible to vote, placed an advertisement in the Wayne County Mail Newspaper, and

posted 5 yards signs through the Walworth and Ontario area. Thanks go out to WTA members Pat Yates, Kathy Uerz, Jean Stein, & Julie Diffenderfer who allowed us to place signs in their yards.

The WTA is currently engaging in its VOTE-COPE drive for the 2008-2009 school year. We are asking all members to donate at least \$1 per paycheck - members who signed up for this deduction previously do not have to do anything as the deduction continues year after year.

Unlike the NEA-NY where PAC were automatic for every member, NYSUT collects its political action funding through VOTE-COPE. Without your donation NY-SUT's capabilities are limited.

President's Message

Save the date- the Making Strides for Breast Cancer walk will be held at Frontier Field on October 5, 2008. The event is cosponsored by NYSUT and will mark the second year in a row in which the WTA participated. More information regarding signing up to participate and collecting donations will be distributed the first week of the 2008-2009 school year.

The WTA is currently working on an MOA that will allow members to take 1/2 paid day for breast and prostate cancer screening. This 1/2 day screening will not be deducted from you accumulated sick days. You will be eligible for 1 paid will be distributed Thursday 1/2 day cancer screening per year. If you have already used a sick day for this current school year, you will be able to apply for a 1/2 day

credit to be

added to your sick bank. There will be more specific information as to what you need to do to take advantage of this MOA including providing proof of screening, once the MOA has been signed and goes into effect. Finding breast or prostate cancer early when it is most treatable can make the difference between life and death. The American Cancer Society recommends yearly mammograms starting at age 40 and continuing for as long as a woman is in good health. A breast exam by a doctor or nurse should be part of a periodic health exam, about every three years for women in their 20s and 30s and every year for women 40 and older.


